Quick facts

- 1 baby dies every **9** minutes from tetanus 
- **160** babies die each day from tetanus 
- MNT has been eliminated from **20** countries since 2000 
- **3** doses of tetanus vaccine = immunity from tetanus 
- Woman + vaccine = protected baby 
- **US\$1.80** protects 1 mother and her future children 
- The Eliminate Project saves & protects **61 million** moms & babies 
- Elimination = **<1** case of MNT per 1,000 live births ~~MNT~~
