On Thursday, November 1st the Greater Woodbury Kiwanis celebrated their 89th Charter Night at Nicolosi's. Jim Meehan welcomed everyone and did the Invocation while President Rich Stahler called to order the evening program. Betty Limanni read the Objectives of Kiwanis International. We had greetings from NJ District Governor, Joe Teti, and from Division 2, Lt Governor, Kaitlin McCann. Our Keynote Speaker was, Robert Bumpus, Executive Director of Regional Achievement Center for Legion 7. Legion of Honor Members were recognized for their years of service: Newt Weiss-52 years, Ed Barry-44 years, Howard Ballinger-40 years, Chip MacDonald-29 years, Jeff Morris-29 years, and Charlie Currier-25 years. Betty Limanni was presented the Hixson Award.

Amelia Kressler told us that the Friendship Force of Southern New Jersey Club hosted 5 communications professionals from Moldova in September for 8 days. The opportunity came through the Open World Program which is sponsored by the Library of Congress and is open to professionals in the former Soviet Bloc countries. The purpose is to share best practices in various professional fields with counterparts in these countries.

Our all-volunteer club was asked to provide 32 hours of professional development, home host and provide a cultural experience for these 5 individuals and their support team-an interpreter and a program manager.
